Procedures for access to the SMAArt instrumentation and competences

The access to the instrumentation and competences of Centre SMAArt is ruled by:

- Regulations for the operation of the Centre of Excellence SMAArt.
- Rate Table of the Centre of Excellenec S.M.A.Art

Access is open to internal researchers of the University and to those external to it, according to the art. 1.5; 2.1; 2.3; 3.1 e 3.2 of the Regulation of the Centre.

The access request is presented trough a proposal, duly compiled, whose model can be downloaded by the present website.

The provision is released by the President of the Centre, on the base of the indications of the Scientific Council, which evaluates the request taking into account:

- scientific quality and innovation of the proposal;
- aims and feasibility of the planned measurements.

The provision is non-transferable and is released after the assessment of the scientific requirements of the project and provided the payment of the due rates.

The costs are determined by the President of the Centre, following the Rate Tables of the Centre SMAArt approved by the Council of the Centre and by the Executive Committee of the University.

The access, as long as demonstrated to have exclusive aims of scientific study and research and provided the finality of the measurements are comprised in the specific scientific interest of the Centre, can be on the base of exclusive reimbursement of the costs sustained by the Centre.

Access request

The access request is sent by e-mail (or regular post or fax) and is presented compiling the dedicated form downloadable from this site. The address is indicated in the form.

The applicant, as indicated in the downloadable form, declares his personal details and institution, describes the project that requires the scientific measurements, and lists the instrumentation needed together with all the other information considered relevant for the evaluation of the proposal.

All those access requests that refer to cases not explicitly comprised in the present rules will be subject, case by case, to separate evaluations and specific agreements.
